

## President's Report – Frances Refalo

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The start of the 2021 season was met with smoke hazards throughout NSW when we would normally be grading and getting ready for the start of the football season. Many from our clubs were fighting fires and trying to keep their homes and their families safe.

Let's now jump forward to March of the 2021 season, where again tested with a one in one hundred year rainfall and flood that broke the banks of the Nepean & Hawkesbury Rivers and flooded all the way down through to the Hawkesbury Region.



We saw Henry Lawson Football Club, Colo Soccer Football Club and Lowland Wanderers Football Club suffering immense damage to their fields as well as their canteen. At Lowland Wanderers you couldn't even see the top of their canteen, it was totally submerged underwater. We then witnessed tremendous community spirit as local communities came together to help these clubs get back on their feet so football could continue.

This season the Association maintained steady numbers of registrations with approximately 12,565 player registrations and 2,663 volunteers during the winter season, further along within this report you will see a more detailed breakdown of all the statistics.

Numbers like these are only achieved with the determination, hard work and commitment of volunteers of our member clubs. No matter how large or small your club or committee is, the same work and effort is required by clubs to ensure deadlines are met, teams are graded, nominations are completed, and teams are formed all in readiness for that first day of the season. I would like to express my deepest thanks to every one of the club committee members, no matter what role you have within your club you all play a massive part. I also would like to thank you for the hospitality you showed my fellow Board members and myself when we come and visit your club and grounds. It was a shame I didn't get round to seeing all the clubs this season as that is one part of my job I really enjoy.

### FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT

At the 2019 Nepean Annual Awards Dinner, sadly this was the last one we have had, you may have heard me mention several projects that were planned for our district, over \$9.5 million in value. It is with pleasure that I can report the following;

#### Warradale FC

currently the master plan is with council for approval, after that there will be another public viewing. Warradale are hoping to have a positive outcome and an announcement to be made early in 2022.

#### Wentworth Falls FC

Following decades of fundraising and working with Blue Mountains City Council it was an exciting day in March when Wentworth Falls FC's new club house and amenities building worth \$1.4 Million was officially opened. It's just amazing to see where they came from to what they have now.

### Blue Mountains FC

This project is well on its way thanks to a great working relationship with Blue Mountains City Council. Funding from council and Federal Government has made the plans of the new car park and reallocation of the canteen possible. If you have visited Knapsack Park prior to the end of June, you would have noticed the new car park which has now been



completed and the next part of this project is the reallocation and club house and amenities building which is expected to be completed by mid-year 2022. As like all projects that are currently in progress, Covid has caused some major delays and has blown out the expected completion dates.

### Jamisontown FC

This project has been slow to start but its great to see the amenities building upgrade at Eileen Cammack Reverse now underway.

### St. Clair United Soccer Club

With funding from the Sate Government, St. Clair United have been working with Penrith City Council on their new amenities building at Mark Leece Oval. This project is almost completed, we are just awaiting defects to be repaired and handover to happen which if everything does to plan should happen soon. We envisage St. Clair United will be starting their 2022 season in their new amenities building.

**Build Wellness and Wellbeing:** Pledging to promote and implement awareness and commitment to wellness within the football communities, NFA took steps to provide a positive gameday experience for everyone with the launching of the Respectful Sidelines campaign in 2021.

Clubs were provided with A-Frames and four inserts, aimed at promoting respectful behaviour. Each club displayed the same insert for the set time period, and clubs were encouraged to discuss the content with its members. The campaign was further promoted through social media platforms and website activities.

NFA additionally supported its members by providing clubs with resources and strategies to deal with issues such as mental health.

**Confirming an Inclusive Association:** 2021 saw increased activity with the Diversity & Inclusion Sub-Committee to promote the importance of all members being accepted and treated fairly and equally.



## CEO's Report – Linda Cerone

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Our association celebrated our 60<sup>th</sup> year this year. Well, we didn't actually celebrate it, not the way we had planned to, but I will still acknowledge it and all those who have gone before us to deliver us to this point in our history.

There's an old saying that goes something like, "Before you drink the water, remember those who dug the well". It's a good thing to do. Acknowledge those who laid the foundations, and those who have continued to build it.

Having worked here for 23 years, and having been involved for a further 7 before my employment, I have had the immense privilege of working with and knowing many of those to whom we owe our thanks. The trailblazers of the past, the spectacular Directors who are currently steering us into a future, the vista of which seems to change daily and equally exciting, is watching those who are slowly making their approach to take the reins one day.

The potential of continued strong leadership of our organisation is evident in the committees of the clubs we serve. The future used to scare me a little, not knowing what's around the corner, but now, it's just exciting because I've replaced not seeing the unknown, with seeing our potential, and our district has it in spades!

### FINANCES

Due to a strong retained earnings base, we have once again been able to navigate the financial uncertainty brought about by a second year of Covid-19 impacts.

Like many other organisations in Australia, we owe thanks to governments who have been able to subsidise our wages bill, our single biggest expense, throughout the extended lockdown in metropolitan Sydney this year. This is great news for the future, as it has allowed us to provide job security to our employees, and in turn provides the association with continued operational knowledge security.

It's almost impossible to predict budget outcomes when you throw a pandemic or two into the mix, two years running, no less! In 2020 we were at least able to get a season played, without finals, and therefore avoiding the serious consideration of refunds. However, in 2021, the year we had hoped would be better and we'd get back to normal, turned out to be more challenging in almost every aspect of our administration.

We did however, settle on partial refunds for senior players, the most hard hit in relation to the value equation of their football. We have also made refund allowance for families who did not use the AKV towards their child/rens fees. It should also go without saying that our operational costs continued to be presented and met.

With the refunds provided by FNSW we retained some of the funds to offset some of the necessary increases to fees that we are expecting in 2022 due to the new competition management and registration system we have moved to following the close down of iCompMan.

We remain in a strong financial position. There are some large expenses coming in the next financial year. Our \$75,000 contribution towards the synthetic pitches at Jamsion Park

will fall due. We will return approximately \$88,000 in registration rebates and a further \$37,000 (approx.) in registration rebates by way of absorption of registration fee increases. \$11,000 is also earmarked for an exciting new coaching initiative in 2022. Our wages bill is also expected to rise, with the appointment of a new Community Football Development Manager and a Digital Media/Marketing Manager, both of who, we believe will not only add value to our organisation, but will also introduce further revenue streams, which we hope, will ultimately lessen the need for fee increases in the future and bring better value to families for the registration fees.

### **GRASSROOTS CONTACT, SUPPORT & EDUCATION**

Another quiet year as far as face to face contact with our stakeholders goes, but another year where we've learnt to hone our communication skills to keep people informed. All our meetings have been held online, ensuring that we continued with a business as usual approach.

Our staff spent time on their professional development while working from home and our board of Directors also took part in an online course presentation on managing a community enterprise.

Added to this, are what feels like thousands of webinars to help us get better at things. All this education, under normal circumstances, would be difficult to fit into a normal work week, but we've chosen to look at these opportunities as the silver lining to our Covid-19 lockdowns.

### **ASSOCIATION STAFF**

We've had some changes this year and we're still not finished with the changes in our staff landscape. Due to the stop/start nature of 2021, we have as yet not employed a Community Football Development Manager, but we hope to soon, along with a Digital Media/Marketing guru.

Alicia Green left us to take maternity leave, presenting us with a beautiful little girl named Blake in May this year. Alicia will re-join the team in early February 2022.

While Alicia was on maternity leave, Eric Alvarez admirably filled in as Competition Manager, as steep learning curve for someone who has only been with us a year, but he did a fine job, even if his inaugural season was cut short by 50%.

Frank Seni continues to hold our accounts in good hands, and also does a great job managing the majority of our registrations too.

Christine McManus joined our team as a maternity leave replacement, and while she leaves us in December, we've been all the richer for having her with us for 10 months.

Aileen Reyes joined our team as the NRG/Nepean Summer Football Administrative Assistant, and she also looks after general admin within the association – what a brilliant asset to our team.

Sue Henderson left us in June to pursue a career in the NSW Police. Branka Popovic stepped into the NFC Admin part-time role, and having come from the NFC sub-committee

ranks, she did so seamlessly and NFC continue to run without a hitch (well, except for Covid of course).

Laurie Solomon continues to care for the Cook Park facility on a part-time basis, however, he did stand down for several months while we were in lockdown.

I love working with this team. Their commitment to their roles and to delivering what our clubs and our board need is admirable.

### **STRATEGIC PLANNING**

Strategic planning has continued to be a very active part of the association's governance, and an area where we continue to challenge ourselves and the services we deliver, along with the mindset we use to do so, while always keeping an eye on the future needs of the organisation.

Strategic planning continues to look at opportunities for facility development, but for me, I've very much enjoyed the human side of our strategic planning, such as how can we develop better coaches, increase female participation, retain players, develop relationships and links within the community and ensure that we have the overall health and wellness of our members at the core of all we do.

We spent time this year forging partnerships within the community to help strengthen our knowledge base and community relationships. We have worked regularly and strategically with Football NSW to ensure we're aligned with the whole of football strategy.

We have developed two new sub-committees this year. The first being The Board of the Future Working Group, who are looking at long term, best practices regarding building and maintaining a strong and resilient leadership base that will go some way to future-proofing our Association.

The Second Sub-Committee in the Diversity and Inclusion Sub-Committee. This committee is looking at our position regarding diversity and inclusion, to ensure that we are always doing all that we can to keep our organisation diverse and inclusive. We have also commenced work with Indigenous groups to build stronger relationships with our district's indigenous community.

Finally as part of our partnership development, we're working on an MOU with Western Sydney Wanderers that we hope will benefit both organisations for many years to come.

### **WINTER FOOTBALL**

On the 26<sup>th</sup> June 2021, our Winter season came to a grinding halt. We waited as the weeks passed by hoping to see a swift end to NSW Health's public health orders, keeping our community in lock down. Of course, that release came too late, and we along with the rest of the metro associations within FNSW footprint were left with no option but to cancel the season. To my knowledge, this has never happened before. It was not a pleasant thing to do, or to navigate through, but I believe that in the end, we came through it all okay.

Following horrendous bushfires, that circled our district and saw some of our outlying areas under serious threat, we barely recovered from the smoke before we had to rally on through floods in March that put Colo SFC & Lowland Wanderers SC completely underwater, and

Henry Lawson FC's new facility also falling victim to flood waters. But all the natural disasters couldn't stop the excitement and the official inaugural season launch of the Waratah & Ruby Leagues in March. While neither competition got to finish their first season, the competitions were well received and appear to be growing for 2022.

The mood within the football community is a hopeful one. We, along with our clubs and their members, are encouraged by the country's vaccination rates, which should allow us to resume our sport in 2022 after two years of disruptions. If the enthusiasm for the upcoming 2021/22 Summer Football season is anything to go by 2022 is going to be a great year.

### **SUMMER FOOTBALL**

Graham Chapman & Aileen Reyes have been doing great work in the Summer Football team that is giving back some hope to football for 2022.

After playing a shortened summer season in 2021, we are due to start the 2021/22 season in December, when we would normally be finishing. This has been necessary due to the impact the Lockdown had on our operations, but, the message from the players is clear.... "We want to play, no matter what!".

I'm very grateful to our Summer Football team for the hard work they do to deliver this very popular part of our sport.

### **INTO 2022**

It's has, once again been a honour to work with our Directors, my Staff, our governing bodies and local and state governments and it's been a special honour working with our club committees, who have shown great resilience and hope during such an unsettled year. All amazing people who inspire me to do my best.

What I've learnt over the past two seasons is that crises like the Covid-19 pandemic reinforce the power of community and create the opportunity for change.

I'm looking forward to playing my part in a team who are committed to change, not for changes sake, but change for the better. Change that empowers our volunteer workforce, that challenges participants to be the best version of themselves, to be not only better athletes but better humans. That engages our broader community to be part of our football community. Change that heals rifts, fosters reconciliation and inspires and promotes diversity, inclusion and fun in all that we do.

But most of all, I hope to be part of a change that inspires and empowers future leaders to want to be future leaders. So when it does come time for a changing of the guard, there are the right people in place to take over and continue delivering the positive impact that our sport as on so many parts of our community.

# Sub-Committee Report – Nepean FC 2021

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### *OVERVIEW*

Overall, 2020/2021 was a reasonably successful year even with the impact of Covid. 2020 and 2021 challenged us in terms of the jolting experience of the pandemic to the uncertainty of that impact on community sport.

We have steered through considerable operational changes and rode through the craziness of 2021. Our report details the financial and club highlights and areas of consideration and improvement.

The success of our boy's youth teams in producing enough club championship points to ensure that they were promoted to Boys Youth League 2 (3 tier comp) for 2022 and not to mention the success of our Senior women in finishing 2nd on the championship ladder.

The purchase of the VEO Camera system enabled coaches to better analyse their games and to focus on areas of improvement. The aim is to continue our strategies to further gain competitiveness.

We aligned our strategy to the mission of our club and tried to ensure that we had a common understanding of the strategy, and focused our effort to provide strategic results. We will continue to work with and invest in branding and sponsorship to ensure we raise the NFC profile to become more attractive to players and sponsors and ensure our future success.

### *AREAS OF RISK OR CONCERN*

#### 1. Impact of COVID

COVID will continue to impact NFC throughout the 2021/22 season. Many families are still feeling the effects of job loss and or reduced income and are likely to feel the effects over the next 6 months due to the restrictions imposed throughout 2021. Outstanding player payments are difficult to chase, and many players will require extended payment plans.

Sponsors are also likely to have been impacted and may be difficult to onboard for the 2022 season. This has been reflected in the 2022 budget with a conservative \$40k target set.

#### 2. Senior Men's Development Year

With no promotion/relegation for the 2022 season for senior men, the 2022 season will see our senior men playing for nothing more than the grand final. The challenge this

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coming season will be to balance performance outcome v player expenditure when there is no chance of promotion. The senior men are a flagship team within the club and can attract sponsors when performing well, so the team's performance is still vital despite no chance of promotion.

### *AREAS OF POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITY*

#### 1. Women's World Cup

With the women's world cup only 2 years away, women's football is increasingly in the spotlight and an excellent opportunity for clubs to attract greater participation of female players. The attraction of GSAP and Women's Youth players continues to be a challenge, so providing we are positioned well with our women's programs and should be able to leverage off the promotion of women's football that will exist during the next 12-18 months.

This will mean an increase in promoting our women's teams on social media to ensure we are at the forefront of parents' minds when looking for that initial step into representative football for their young girls and women.

#### 2. NFC Operational Plan

We continue to update and follow the NFC operational strategy that was put together 18 months ago. The strategy ensures we are clear about the actions we need to take to hit our medium / long-term strategic goals.

### *TEAMS PERFORMANCE*


#### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

- Boys youth league did well enough to be promoted to tier 2 for 2022 (3 tier competition)
- U15s NPL2 undefeated, U14s and U13s performed exceptionally well in the competition and finished top 3 on the ladder
- WPL 17s performed well, U15s performances were sound but weren't clinical, U14s started slowly but gathered momentum and were moving up the ladder with improved performances
- SAP & GSAP had significant improvements in their football development
- AYL produced several players that moved across to our NPL, and several more moved to other NPL clubs. Coaches working well in developing players at extreme different technical and tactical levels
- Most of our coaching staff are fully qualified, and if not, they are enrolled to do their C-licence. Our NPL boy's youth, every squad has two qualified coaches per team as these teams play for club championship points and require the most attention to push for Boys Youth League 1 promotion.

### AREAS OF CONCERN

- Our NFA clubs are hesitant to send female players to NFC, and we tried to engage with some clubs; however, they didn't want to 'lose' their players. We have been told that one of a Nepean FA Clubs coach and almost the entire female squad went to Mt Druiitt. Very disappointed that our grass- root players bypass NFC. We need to improve our relationships with the clubs and stress that NFC is a relevant pathway for players. We were organising with Springwood United some team engagement activities; however, these were cut short with Covid.
- Our GSAP development is solid, and we have numerous players that have been selected for the FNSW institute program and other NPL1 clubs.
- AYL – with another association, St George pulling out of the competition will further diminish the development of these players and teams. All associations should be involved to give this development league relevance
