





During the AW2 CUFC v BMFC game on Sunday 19th June, one of our CUFC players, Leanne Shiagetz collapsed on the field, and BMFC player Caitlin Scott was immediately at Leanne's side gauging her well being. Once we were able to safely walk Leanne off the field, Caitlin disregarded her own team and stayed with Leanne until the Paramedics arrived, and during their stay whilst triaging Leanne's condition.

Caitlin did not have to do this, but her professional life kicked in and for her selfless act in assessing and comforting Leanne throughout this considerable amount of time, she truly shone in her empathy, humanity and sportsmanship.

On behalf of the CUFC, AAW2s and Leanne herself, we thank Caitlin for her help. And we feel she's a very worthy recipient of the fair play award.

President's Report – Frances Refalo

Season 2022 was yet another challenging season, the third one in a row for the Association and our member clubs. Finally, after two interrupted and incomplete seasons due to Covid, we were all eager to start this season. Then the heaven's opened and the rain would not let up. This saw major flooding throughout our district and many fields experiencing flooding of playing surfaces and/or amenities. The devastating outcome for some of our affected clubs, was that they never received access to their fields for most of or in some cases, the entire season.

But in the true Nepean spirit, we rallied to ensure football was played, so I'd like to say a massive thank you to all the clubs and their committees who hosted extra games this season to get the outcome we did.

The Association has been working hard with councils to secure support and funding for various projects within our region.

Director Steve Hurley provides a comprehensive account of our work in the infrastructure space in his report.

The season saw a slight fall in player numbers. The association's final membership numbers for the winter season were 11,725 players. This is down from last year by 841, however registrations are slightly higher than our 2019 pre covid numbers. The reduction in numbers was reported across almost all associations and all sports; and now that we have finally finished a full season, we expect that the numbers will begin to grow again.

As an association we constantly strive to improve the standard of competition within our district. This year saw the first full season of the newly formed Ruby & Waratah Leagues, and we have been and will continue to have a big push on Female Football, not only in player participation numbers, but in all areas of female football. Our aim is for an overall participation increase of 7%.

Nepean's summer competition is going strong with all fields in operation on all weeknights, full to the brim at the Jamison Park Synthetics.

It is pleasing to note that we are starting to see a decline in on field player disciplinary events. I believe that this can be attributed to a few different areas, one being the support the association receives from club committees when putting processes and procedures in place to remove violence from our game. There will be a more detailed report further also from our Director responsible for the Grievance and Disciplinary portfolio, Gail Macleod-Jones, who has done some terrific work in this area of our governance.

Congratulations to all league winners on a successful season, their determination and consistency throughout the season has paid off. To our Nepean Cup winners who showed their talent during a very congested season, it was satisfying to finally be able to deliver this popular tournament again this year.

I offer my congratulations to all teams who represented us in the FNSW Champion of Champions again this season, and to our finalist in the Champion of Champions U14 Boys – Pitt Town FC and U15 Girls – Emu Plains FC. Hold your heads high, you have done your

team, your club and Association proud, and it's an amazing achievement to reach the level you have this season.

To all the clubs that over the past 3 years have celebrated significant anniversaries, including our Association's 60th in 2021, congratulations on this amazing achievement and I wish your club many more years of football to come.

My thanks go also to the clubs who have shown their support for us, and for the hospitality shown on my visits to each club. Enjoy your summer and I hope to see you all next season.

I normally don't single out staff members, but this season I feel the need to acknowledge the efforts of Alicia Green our Competition Manager. With the amount of unpredictable rain and fields either under water or unsafe to play on, Alicia was constantly manipulating the draw on a weekly and sometimes daily basis to ensure as many teams as possible got to play their weekend game of football. Thank you for the assistance you provide the Board through the season, as always, it's been a pleasure to work alongside you all.

Finally, to my fellow Board members, thank you for your commitment, dedication, and love for our game. The time you dedicate to the association is time away from your families, so in saying this, I'd like to also acknowledge and thank your families. Working with you all for the betterment of the Association and the football community is always a pleasure and gives me great joy. I look forward to continuing to work with you all.

Director Report – Steve Hurley

Infrastructure

It has been a big year in the infrastructure space for the Nepean Football community. There has been a lot of work in lobbying and organising with Councils and political leaders, so I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of my fellow Directors and NFA staff for their assistance and support in these areas. It has been a massive team effort in getting to where we are. Lots of grant applications have been submitted mainly around the Westinvest grant scheme which are detailed below.

The Westinvest is a State Government grant designed for Western Sydney with 8 local councils eligible and all 4 Nepean area councils are within the 8. The first round is competitive and has a \$1.6 billion pool, with second round being non competitive, leveraging a \$3.4 billion pool.

The total for football projects across Blue Mountains and Penrith City Councils is \$47.6m. Hawkesbury have received early approval for \$5.4 million for improvements to Woodbury Reserve, Glossodia. While the project isn't entirely football focused, a good portion of the upgrade will benefit Glossodia FC.

These are the Football related projects we have submitted for Westinvest with Penrith Council: (Total \$29.1m)

- Cook Park Precinct Sport, Play, Grandstand and Mixed Recreation upgrade with overall project valued at \$19,100,000.
- Jamison Park Amenity Building to support the new Synthetic Surfaces, South Penrith, project valued at \$3,750,000.
- Gow Park Amenity Building, Mulgoa, project valued \$2,000,000.
- Andromeda Oval, Cranebrook, project valued \$1,250,000.
- Parkes Avenue (including Rance Oval) Sport and Recreation Precinct upgrade, project valued at \$1,500,000.
- Cook Parade Court upgrade, St Marys including 2 futsal courts, project valued at \$1,500,000

Blue Mountains Council football related projects are: (Total \$18.5)

- Summerhayes Park – Amenities, field and carpark with overall project valued at \$12,000,000.
- St Johns Oval – Lights, carpark and drainage with overall project valued at \$2,500,000.
- Glenbrook Oval – Lights, carpark and amenities with overall project valued at \$2,500,000.
- Gloria Park – Lights, irrigation and field renewal with overall project valued at \$1,500,000.

Nepean FC

It has been a challenging year with the representative program, facing the same issues as our member clubs with unprecedented wet weather. This paved the way for some innovative training methods and encouraged some out of the box thinking.

Our Skills Acquisition Program and Girls SAP programs were incredibly successful this year and showcase some of our future stars of football. It is a real testament to the hard work by local clubs with the talent being produced as these players embark on their football careers.

Our Association Youth League program was well represented in the competition with our Under 15s side making the Grand Final. Next year there will be an additional age group for this program with the introduction of an Under 18's age group.

The Boys Youth League program was a tough competition this year with Promotion (and Relegation) on offer based on Club Championship points. We managed to finish mid table in a turbulent year, with our Under 16's reaching the preliminary final.

The Girls Youth League program was another tough competition with our teams competing strongly across the board. A lot of players backed up for older teams regularly to manage player shortages and ensure we had coverage across all age groups. A big thank you to these players (and parents) for demonstrating great club spirit and supporting each other through these times.

The Senior Women's program have had a season of re building and picked up some great results in the process. The year has enabled some younger players to experience Senior football and will benefit from this experience for years to come.

The Senior Men's program have enjoyed a successful season with a relatively young squad. First grade finished 2nd on the table and reached the Grand Final.

We have re-structured the technical space for season 2023 and trials are all completed. We look forward to the opportunities presented for season 2023.

Female Football Report

NFA were successful in being able to offer individual age groups in the female space again in 2022. This is a wonderful achievement and reflects all the hard work clubs and the association have put towards building the female football space. Well Done to everyone who has worked hard towards this goal!

With all the excitement of the Women's World Cup coming our way in 2023 let's continue to develop the depth and quality in our female football space.

NFA will be offering three new programs that will be delivered as part of the NSW Football Legacy Plan.

Daughters And Dads Active & Empowered Program.

This is an educational and football development program that runs over a 9 week period (one session a week). Further information on the program can be found at <https://www.daughtersanddads.com.au/Facilitators> It is important to clarify that DAD is required to be a male role model and can be father, uncle, grandfather, older brother etc and is not limited the participants father.

Girls Love Football

This is a skill based introductory program to football that is delivered pre-winter football season. The weekly sessions are designed to provide flexibility to the currently offered 'traditional' football opportunities for youth girls. The program is 6 weeks of weekly 45-minute sessions with two age groups U12-U14 and U15-U17

Kick On For Women

This is an introductory program to football that is ideally delivered in line with school terms. The weekly sessions are designed to provide basic skills, football rules, fitness, fun and small sided games. The program duration is 8 weeks of 45 minute weekly session and is available to women 16 years and above.

NFA have rolled out these programs and will be upskilling and supporting clubs who are interested in becoming host clubs.

Female Football Standing Committee

This committee was formed to give clubs a place to work together to discover what is working and what needs working on in the female football space within our association. The committee members discuss ideas on how to improve all aspects of football for females as well as developing formats for events such as Come And Try Days and Female Football Week activities. If your club doesn't have a representative on this committee, I encourage you to find someone who is a female football champion within your club and ask them to be your club representative.

This year I again served on the Football NSW Female Football Standing Committee, ensuring that our association, and our female participants have a voice at the table of our State governing body.

Competition's Report – Alicia Green

The 2022 season was a challenge to say the least. Coming off the back of two disruptive seasons due to Covid we were ready for a “normal” season if there is such a thing.

We saw the introduction of a new Competition Management System, Dribl, due to the wind-up of iCompMan. This was a huge learning curve for all staff and club committees who appear to have found their way around it with minimal dramas. Dribl is proving to be a fantastic competition management system with a few teething issues we hope to have fixed for the start of the 2023 season.

The start of the season was far from anyone's expectation with the first two rounds delayed due to rain. During this time, and the weeks following, we made approximately 600 changes per week to accommodate field closures and grounds that were still unavailable. Unfortunately, we did see a handful of clubs who did not gain access to their fields for the entire year. I was happy to see the conclusion of the regular season and hope to never experience a repeat.

We were blessed with the new synthetic fields at Jamison Park. If it wasn't for this facility, we would not have managed to play the number of games we did throughout the season. We would have seen multiple full washouts without these fields simply because of the limited time to play these games during our regular Winter Hire period of local grounds.

The full number of scheduled fixtures for 2022 was 9,760. Of these 9,760 fixtures, we had a total of 2,172 that we washed out and cancelled. Analysing further, there were a total of 3,424 competition games scheduled for the season, and 372 of these were cancelled. This works out to be 10.9% of games cancelled. Some competition age groups and divisions saw 3 full rounds washed out, whilst others were lucky to have no rounds washed out. In the non-competition space, we had a total of 6,246 scheduled games, and of these, 1,755 were cancelled. This worked out to be 28% of games cancelled.

It was fantastic to finish the season in its entirety with limited washouts. Towards the end of the season, we saw a very full schedule of regular season catch-up games, Championship Tournament Series games, and Nepean FA Cup games.

We were so excited to organise and host our Annual Nepean FA Finals Day, the Nepean FA Cups, and the One Point Health Men's Nepean Cup Finals. After 3 years without these events, the staff were very excited as I'm sure the clubs and participants were. In our eyes, these were going ahead rain, hail, or shine.

Coinciding with the Finals Day, we decided to hold a MiniRoos Gala Day to make up for some of the games cancelled during the season. Both the finals day and gala day went off without a glitch and we received positive feedback on both the organisation and running of both events.



Congratulations to all our Championship Tournament Finals winners and our Nepean FA Cup winners. I'd also like to take the time to congratulate all our league winners. Taking out the title of your age group and division requires hard work and consistency and you should be very proud of your achievements.



Finally, I would like to congratulate all our representatives at the Football NSW Champion of Champions. In particular, I would like to acknowledge and congratulate Pitt Town FC U14 Boys and Emu Plains FC U15 Girls who both made it to the Champion of Champions finals. Having the pleasure of watching both games, both were unfortunate not to come away with the win, Pitt Town holding their opposition 1-0 up until the 65th minutes.

In closing I would like to thank our club volunteers, our members and my fellow staff members for their patience this year. I am certainly looking forward to a smoother and less disruptive 2023.

CEO's Report – Linda Cerone

I think that just about the only thing that hasn't changed in football over the last two or three years is the ultimate aim of the game, which is to score more goals than your opposition in order to win the game.

Change & Evolution & Why It's Important

It's from the back rooms of the game that we see the biggest changes. Changes in how we engage with our members, changes in how we communicate between authorities, changes in how we register our players, in how we support our coaches and volunteers and in how we interact with each other (elbow knocks and fist pumps replacing handshakes), and how we assess and report our outcomes.

Streamlining how we deliver the game, our engagement methods and our communication methods have been necessary not only because it's what our customers demand in order to fit in with their busy lifestyles, but to help the volunteer workforce manage the heavy workloads in their ever-diminishing free time. These aspects of sport administration were previously an area of interest or curiosity but have now become a high focus part of our operations. Clubs will have seen this in the expectations of service and product delivery expected by their members. For these reasons, we continue to review all aspects of our operations on a regular basis to ensure that we're doing all that we can to keep up with technology and with expectations.

A Healthy Bank Balance

This year we again finished our financial year in a strong position which enables us to deliver football at one of the lowest association fee brackets in NSW. We continue to be conservative in our expenditure and show consideration of our socio-economic demographic when setting our fees and pricing our programmes. Pleasingly, we've been able to assist some clubs with Venue Maintenance and Facility Development Grant approvals, and we will continue to offer this facility to clubs.

Our Strategy & Our Team Members

On a personal level, career-wise, I have stepped away from many of the day-to-day hands-on operational tasks such as registering players and dealing with the day-to-day competition and disciplinary matters, handing over these operational functions to my very capable team members. My day to day tasks may have changed, but my focus remains firmly on operational and management structures and how I interact and serve both the board of directors and the football community. I thank my team every day for their work and their dedication to excellence, but I'd like to go on record here and thank them once again for being the nuts and bolts of the association's framework.

While I love the challenges of helping to develop and deliver strategic goals and developing processes and programs that align with our strategic goals, I'll admit to often missing the challenges of the old days, of solving a competition, registration or accounting crisis. But I'm equally proud of our staff members and the pro-active and helpful way they go about attending to all facets of our operations and servicing our customers. After a couple of rocky years, I feel like we've really hit the sweet spot again with the team we

have here at Nepean FA and I hope I don't have to see any departures in this area any time soon.

Equally amazing are the Directors and Sub-Committee members who are part of the Nepean FA team. Brilliant community people, who are driven by equal parts of a love of their community, a love our of sport and a desire to make our space the most excellent place to be spending recreation hours.

The Work of Many Sub-Committees

We're very fortunate at Nepean FA that previous Directors had the foresight to adopt a "one tent, one tribe" model for football in this district, bringing into the fold both the Referees Group and the Representative Club, and from that model, we've nurtured and continue to develop a progressive, innovative and collaborative triumvirate, who share the aim of delivering the very best football we can. I love working with these people!

Other sub-committee work that has been on our agendas this year is looking at the vision of what we want the board of the future to look like, ensuring that we consider handovers, and addressing the skillsets that a capable board needs to lead a district into the future.

Diversity & Inclusion

We've taken a serious look at Diversity & Inclusion in our D&I Sub-Committee, assessing ways in which we can ensure that our policies address Diversity and Inclusion at every stage of their development as well as looking at events that will send a clear message to the greater community, that football, and our clubs are welcoming and inclusive, and a place where all people can feel safe and valued.

We also spent many meetings looking at how we engage with indigenous members of our community and how, as an organisation we can show respect, support and a willingness to work harmoniously with our indigenous community members moving forward. There is much work to be done in this area to correct the past.

Wellness & Wellbeing

Our Wellness team has studied the many ways that wellness can be incorporated into our programming and operations, such as considering the mental health of members and enabling others to see signs that help might be required. Developing and discovering what we can do to help and/or advocate for clubs who fall victim to climate events, and indeed, how we, as an organisation can make changes to reduce our impact on the climate crisis.

We've been particularly pro-active in making our sidelines safe and enjoyable for all members of our sport, including referees, fellow spectators, club officials and players, and have developed educational campaigns and resources to help in this area. We continue to study options to eradicate referee abuse from our culture or to remove the perpetrators who think it's ok to attack some of our most valuable resources, our referees. We need to send a clear message, that there's no place for people like that on our sidelines or on our fields.

Player violence, while pleasingly on the decrease, is also undergoing a change in how it is tolerated by victims. In a nutshell, they are not tolerating it like they used to, and rightly so. We've seen several instances this season where victims and/or parents of victims have taken their complaint to the police and have had charges pressed and we support this

position. You wouldn't go up to a person on the street and punch them, so this writer fails to see why it's ok to do so on a sporting field. I think there's a very clear message that we all have a duty to deliver to our players and that is "don't do it", or they may just find themselves with a very unexpected criminal record, not the sort of added extra that they might have expected when they signed up to play sport! There'll be some changes coming in 2023 that include the re-education of perpetrators before they return to our fields and our sidelines.

Female Football & Gender Equity

Across multiple areas, we've addressed gender equity in our sport. We do this by encouraging more clubs to offer female only teams, in order to help build a strong and deep female player base. We lead by example in having females in leadership positions at both Association and Club levels and by forming and supporting a Female Football Standing Committee, made up of club delegates who are interested and who advocate for gender equity and find solutions to the roadblocks that might be in our way in this area.

Lastly but by no means least, the Association has also allocated funds to develop at least 90 new female coaches across three community football levels, in the hope that as more of the community see that females are perfectly capable of being successful in this traditionally male dominated space, we can encourage others to join in and finally see clearly that football is not just a sport, but a place for everyone to co-exist and have fun. After a false start to this Female Coach Recruitment Program this year, we plan to re-launch this in late 2022 and early 2023.

In Closing – You're Great!

Finally, I'd like to offer my congratulations to all clubs on the outstanding resilience shown during what has been one of the most difficult years to deliver grassroots football in a very long while. It has been heart-warming to see the level of concern and co-operation displayed by clubs towards each other and the free flow of support and assistance given when required. The demonstration by clubs of showing that they work not only for their communities but for football to prosper, for me, has been the biggest sign of the maturity of our sport and of the giant size heart of our district.

Thank you all for contributing to another amazing year in Nepean FA.

Sub-Committee Report – Nepean Referees Group

2022 was the year where our young referees really stepped up and showed what they were capable of. This was partially through necessity as we registered our lowest number of referees in the last few years. However, the Management Committee, supported by our assessment team, took active steps to promote our younger referees to challenging matches, pushing them outside of their comfort zone while supported from the sidelines by our most experienced senior referees.



To that end, NRG promoted 13 referees under the age of 18 to their first senior matches this year, with half of those completing centres on Waratah and Ruby League fixtures. All these young referees were assessed at regular intervals during the year to ensure that they received coaching and guidance on how to improve their craft. All our young referees and our assessment team should be congratulated on the progress they have fostered and attained throughout the season. Many of these young referees will be recommended for the Football NSW Referee Development Program (RDP) for next year's season, where they will be exposed to higher level matches, additional ongoing training, and regular assessment.

This season we had four referees selected for the Referee Development Program (RDP); Conner Marrone, Alistair Wood, Nathaniel Cant, and Emma Buckley. We were also lucky enough to have a referee selected to the FNSW Referee Academy; Molly Godsell. The academy provides a direct pathway to the A-League competitions in Australia. Molly is an extremely talented young referee, who was also selected to represent NRG at the National Youth Championships in September. It is very pleasing as the President to see so many talented referees progressing through our Association, and I am confident that we will see greater numbers in the years ahead.

It would be remiss of me not to mention our Senior referee group and the huge effort they have made in this season. On many occasions, our senior referees made changes to their personal plans to assist the NRG during the season in covering additional matches over and above what they would normally cover, given the impact of Covid, various other illnesses, freakish wet weather, and a general shortage of referees, which made setting appointments extremely challenging during the season.



A special mention goes to Matthew Herring, Murray Stone, and Phil MacDonald. Matthew completed his Level 2 certification this year and was awarded with the Waratah League Reserve Grad final, and the Nepean Cup Men's final. Murray Stone achieved his Level 3 certification this year and officiated the Ruby League Grand Final. Lastly, in just his fourth season officiating, Phil MacDonald was awarded with the Waratah League Grand Final. Phil is well-respected by Nepean clubs and players for his calm demeanour and excellent player management skills. Congratulations to these gentlemen and all our senior referees for their efforts this year.

Lastly, I would like to thank the Management Committee for their tireless efforts in 2022. To call this season a challenge would be an understatement! NRG had several new committee members this year, mixed in with some more experienced members and the energy and enthusiasm carried us through the year. I am personally very optimistic that 2023 will be one of our best years yet.

Sub-Committee Reports – Nepean Summer Football



At Nepean Football Association, we love seeing Summer Football grow. There's nothing better for me personally than seeing nights when we literally have thousands of people playing, supporting, and enjoying our new synthetic fields at Jamison Park. What a 2-year period we all endured but we were determined to remain focused and offer players from our region a solution in what can only be described as a testing time for everyone.

As winter seasons and other sports were decimated, our 2021 solution was to offer summer football that started in December, had a break for January and resumed in the February and March. In that period, we had 1,577 players register for our summer football format.

2022 we have returned to some sort of normality. We returned to our normal tried and tested summer football and that's to commence in September and conclude in December. In our opinion it's all about book ending the calendar year. Summer Football offers a year-round solution for our football loving community and our numbers for this season, again suggests that this format is a success. We have 1,814 players registered. There has been a reduction in adult numbers, but this was due to us not using the grass fields at Jamison Park. We have seen an increase in junior registrations which is perfect as we build for the future. We are shortly trialling summer football on our smaller synthetic fields, and this will allow us to maximise the available space we have at Jamison Park.

Why are we so successful?

It's simple, we apply a business practice to what we do. Players pay to play so we reinvest in our sport by employing a dedicated team to ensure that our players get exactly what they paid for. One crucial ingredient is to never lose focus in our key positioning statement 'same time same place every week'. We always have staff on our fields every night ensuring that referees kick off on time. Our summer football is well known for always being on time, positive regular communication, and a commitment from our loyal team. Like a circus tent magically appears in a community so do our summer football goals, every day our dedicated paid team arrive hours in advance and ensure that when our players and parents arrive everything is set up ready to go.

Reputation is everything!

2023 will be even bigger as we maximise our available space. This season has seen a willingness to play on Friday evenings and in 2023 this will also be part of our Summer Football offerings. Summer Football 5 nights a week!

We've come a long way since starting 9 years ago and now that covid lockdowns and uncertainty is behind us we set our focus to cement summer football as much sought-after sport in our region. Our marketing strategies have been crucial to ensuring that we have our playing community excited and literally standing by their phones and computers to register their teams, so they don't miss out. This year when we opened our bookings, we sold out most age groups within 24 hours. Marketing - a much overstated word in my opinion but with my marketing background I am proud to be part of an organisation that understands the importance of that word. The marketing for our 2023 seasons has already started 👍

In summary it had been an amazing year and we can't wait to unveil new ideas and opportunities in 2023.




