





CEO REPORT - Linda Cerone

In 2024, Nepean FA was once again, a great place to be.

2024 Season In Review

One of our standout achievements was the significant increase in player numbers across all categories, with a record-breaking 13,894 players taking to the field, marking a 13% increase from last year. Notably, female participation surged by an impressive 24%, no doubt spurred by the enthusiasm generated from the successful Women's World Cup, allowing us to surpass our strategic goal of achieving a 7% increase in female participation. The last bastion for female football in our district will be the successful delivery of an Over 30's Women's competition in 2024, and I believe that we're on track to finally achieve this. (ever the optimist!!)



Despite the challenges posed by significant rainfall, which led to a huge number of fixture changes, ably managed by our brilliant competitions crew, our teams successfully completed over 12,000 matches in 2024. This remarkable achievement underscores the resilience and strength of the NFA Clubs to find a way to make what looks like the impossible, possible. This couldn't have been achieved without the co-operation and willingness of NFA clubs to host fellow clubs who were underwater more times than they'd like to remember and staff that were determined to deliver what our membership wanted, namely, a full season.

Finances

The financial year of the club was changed at last year's Annual General Meeting, meaning that this year, we ran on a 15 month financial year, which was at times confusing while assessing reports especially those where comparisons are made to the previous year. I'm looking forward to getting back to a 12 month financial year period from here on in.

The association remains in a strong position financially, with our nett worth including building and assets sitting at \$1,775,472. Stability such as this is achieved over many years of careful financial management, and allows for us to be able to undergo lean years, or at times, big spending, without concern for instability in the following year/s.

At association level in the last financial year, our major project and one of our biggest expenses, other than wages, was the refurbishment the office after 20 years dealing with inefficient layouts and overcrowding of an exceptionally small work space that wasn't foreseen when the office was first established in 2004. We now have a workspace that can accommodate future growth if needed, as well as giving extra work areas to directors or even our affiliate entities of NRG & NFC should they need it.

Delivering a Safer Match Day Experience For Everyone

Nepean FA also celebrated the success of the "If the Armband is Green, They're Under 18" initiative, which provided an extra layer of protection for young referees and reminded everyone on match days to show respect and appropriate consideration towards junior referees. This initiative has been instrumental in reducing verbal abuse towards young referees and has attracted a new wave of participants to the refereeing community. Our intention is to extend this program to Orange & Green armbands for Junior Cadet Referees in 2025.

Furthermore, the Club Cadet Referee Training program, held at regional centres within our district, was a triumph. It introduced younger members to the principles of refereeing while they acted as Game Leaders for MiniRoos teams. This program was well-supported by clubs and translated into increased interest and registrations in refereeing. This program too will continue in 2025.

To address the culture around interactions with match officials, club officials, and opposition teams, the 3 Strike Policy was also introduced this season. The introduction was received with mixed responses and concerns from clubs, however, I believe that our management of this policy has served to demonstrate to clubs that it is a tool that is used with the utmost discretion and care, and is not a policy that is in place to make life difficult. This policy calls for clubs to take responsibility for changing the behaviour of their members, ensuring more respectful interactions both on and off the field. While club committees themselves are supportive of the same ideals shared by the association, that is, a safe and enjoyable environment for everyone to participate in, until a certain subset of society can bring their behaviours and attitudes into line with the reasonable expectations of the association and our clubs, policies such as the 3 Strike Policy will remain in place.

Summer Football

In addition to regular season participation increases, another impressive increase seen this year is in Summer Football participation, further cementing the sport of football as a year-round activity in our district. We have our own Nepean Summer Football Competition at Jamison Park, and we also have clubs in the Hawkesbury, Blue Mountains & Warradale districts hosting summer football activities.

Grant Funding

Working with Staying Alive Health, we have enjoyed a second year of successes in securing grants for the installation of publicly available Defibrillator units in the district, bringing the total in the association's footprint to 25. This initiative is part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety and well-being of players, officials, spectators and members of the public. The availability of these life-saving devices at key locations across the region underscores our proactive approach to health and safety within the community.

Strategic Development

Our strategic development and engagement by local & state government consultations as well as regional club consultations have continued this year too. These sessions bring together the many stakeholders of football to work together to achieve common goals or trouble shoot common issues. The regional meetings also allow us to hone in on specifics relating to clubs in localised areas and we continue to gain great insight and benefits from these meetings.

Affiliate Entities

As the CEO of NFA and its wholly owned entities, Nepean Referees Group and Nepean Football Club, I have this year also been attending the monthly management meetings of both these groups. This has afforded us a much closer relationship with benefits gained by both organisations and the association. I've very much enjoyed the working relationship that I have forged with these two groups this season and look forward to that continuing in the future.

Nepean FC in particular has taken great chunks of my time this season with the club undergoing a much needed full clean up of procedures and processes that had become absolutely necessary, with previous goals, resulting in less than favourable financial outcomes for the club. While it may have been great that the club experienced promotion into a high league for the Men's team, it was felt that this was achieved at the expense of the club's financial stability. It became necessary to implement a very restrictive budget with a rescue loan package from the association to put the club back on an even keel. The much stricter financial oversight will continue for the foreseeable future. Promotion is great, but should never be at the expense of junior football development or providing uneven support to all areas of the club. Building a strong junior pathway from the association into the club and from the club back into the association is another strategic priority that is also enjoying a much stronger focus and control going forward.

The club's executive this year was managed by a combined caretaker executive consisting of myself and three NFA Directors, Martin Ryan, Steve Hurley & Stacey Fanella, two NFC executive management committee members, Kathy Grosse, Secretary and we also welcomed newcomer Claire McFadden into the new role of Female Football Co-ordinator. The other significant difference in the club's governance this season was the inclusion in meetings of the General Committee Members, who proved to be a great asset to the club, both in manpower and in the contribution of fresh ideas. It was my great pleasure to work with all of these people in 2024.

Distinctions Worth Mentioning

I'm loving the change of direction the NFA has taken over recent years to put a spotlight on our volunteers. We do this every month, with our volunteer of the month acknowledgments, of which we receive many nominations, and this award culminates in a Volunteer of the Year for each club being acknowledged at our end of year awards night. However, as far as award nights go, we absolutely scooped the pool this year at the FNSW Awards, with five award winners and a special mention as follows;

To the Directors, what an amazing group you are. Totally and fully focused on district football. Zero personal agendas, absolute candour at all times and just pure service to their community. They are an absolute delight to work with and for.

Finally, to the many club volunteers who I count it a privilege to work with and for, thank you for your care of football, and of your community in general. I do believe that we have limited time left in a society where we can continue to operate in a totally volunteer supported industry, however, I believe that there'll always be a core group of community angels who have the superpowers needed to go the extra mile for their community when no one else will. Above all else I believe that we owe these special people a great debt. Thank You.

All in all, despite the challenges thrown to us by a soggy season, I believe that we have concluded another successful season of delivering football to the Penrith, Hawkesbury, Warragamba & Blue Mountains districts.

DIRECTOR REPORT - Frances Refalo

As the NFA Director holding the Finance portfolio, I am pleased to present the a summary of the Annual Financial Report for Nepean Football Association (NFA) and its major subsidiaries, Nepean Representative Football Club (NFC) and Nepean Referees Group (NRG).

This year we have reverted to our old financial reporting cut offs of October - September. The 2024 financials will show a period of 15 months being July 2023 - September 2024. If you are comparing this year's figures to the ones of 2023, please keep in mind the above as the reason for the slight increase in both the income and expense.

You will find a full audited financial report for Nepean Football Association, towards the back of this Annual Report. Annual Reports for NFC & NRG are presented for adoption at their AGMs. However, I have provided you with a brief summary of each entity below.



NFA

The 2024 season ended on 30th September with a surplus of \$227,893, which places the association in a very healthy financial position, you will see that the total asset of \$2,446,303 with a short-term asset that significantly exceeds its short-term liabilities. As previously mentioned, the slight increase in both income and expense is brought about by the 15-month period as well as the increase in cost of supplies. The two major spending items are Wages and FNSW registration fees.

NFC

Nepean Representation Football Club, unfortunately saw a loss of \$130,177 this season, although there has been a loss, the current committee have made significant reductions in Coaches and Managers payments, Ground Hire and Management Fees have all had a significant decrease from the previous year. Player's payments and Physio are the two major expenses within this entity.

The management committee has done well to rain in the costs of representative football and I'm sure this will continue in order to bring the club back to a more secure financial footing.

NRG

Nepean Referees Group, the last of our entities that I will be reporting on has also finished the 2024 season with a loss of \$5,807, I put this down to the 14-month period, having the cost of 2 end of year presentations, extra referee coverage in the back end of the season during the Championship Tournament Series. Nepean Referees Group is still in a healthy financial position with total assets of \$58,078 with a short-term asset that significantly exceeds its short-term liabilities.

DIRECTOR REPORT - Martin Ryan

2024 was a busy year for NFA Board Members. I took on two new portfolios this year. Added to my Strategy Portfolio were Risk and NFC's Management Team.



Strategy

NFA's consistent strategy has enabled successful collaborations with our stakeholders. Our Collaboration with LGA's, State and Federal Governments secured \$160 million in grants for Western Sydney's sporting facilities. This momentum propels NFA and our members toward infrastructure improvements through to 2030.

The Blue Mountains was not included in the above success. For this reason, we brought the BMCC Mayor, State Member and Federal Member to a meeting to realign the focus on Football in the Blue Mountains. We will continue these meetings and take advantage of election cycles etc. over the next 3-5 years to bring continued focus to the Blue Mountains.

Talking Strategy with NFA Clubs

It is wonderful to see that our clubs are embracing a strategic culture, this has also become an important step in club accreditation with FNSW and the FA's Club Changer Program. Once again in 2024 we held regional meetings with club groups. We collaborated on operational and strategic issues in the alignment of our common goals, the wellbeing of our members and the advancement of Football in our regions.

Strategy Objectives and Strategic Pillars

Our Strategy remains consistent in 2024 our key Strategic Objectives are:

1. Building for the Future (Build Infrastructure + Evolve Our Organisation).
2. Maximise for the Future (Promote Inclusive Competitions + Woman's Football).
3. Creating Impact (Build Wellness and Wellbeing + Increase Football Excellence).

Next Steps

Building a Strategic Plan is a critical step for all clubs and organisations. Long term success, however, will only come from the successful implementation of the agreed strategic objectives. For this reason, in 2024 NFA doubled down on our key strategic objectives to ensure that they were still relevant. We are also creating a program discipline to implement these plans; a final workshop is scheduled for December.

Below are some examples of some key areas requiring future proofing for both NFA and Clubs alike:

1. **Diversification of our business model:** Summer Football is a successful example of diversity in our business model. With the introduction of a \$100m indoor sports complex in Western Sydney, NFA will work with FNSW and Penrith Council to fully capitalise this facility i.e. Representative and Grass Roots Futsal for Western Sydney.
2. **Female Football:** We have seen growth in Female Football, 20% growth in 2024. How we maintain this successful growth without a World Cup focus will require planning.
3. **Wellness and Wellbeing:** 'Good Match Day Experience' is a basic requirement for all members, Clubs and NFA works to make this possible. Looking to the future how do we engage new areas of support, considering the positive impact we bring to Western Sydney's extended community in health and fitness? This is a subject we have raised with State and Federal Sport Ministers and hope to explore in greater detail in 2025.
4. **Board of the Future:** Taking into account NFA's and Clubs future challenges, NFA initiated a program to exam future Director skills to maintain NFA over the next 10 years.

We are very happy with our Strategy and look forward to greater implementation and measurements of the success of our Strategy over the coming years.

Risk

In 2023-24 I took on the management of NFA's Risk Register. These risks were specific to NFA's Board and not operational risks, which are managed by our CEO. As in all business Operation Risk can be raised to a Board level at the discretion of a CEO.

Key Risks in 2023-24 Mitigated

1. **The Contractual and Financial Management of NFC, multiple risks.** NFA in 2023 agreed to finance NFC financial shortfalls but requested key non-negotiables to be adhered to. These risks were mitigated by the NFC Executive Team during 2024. NFA Board Members took a hands-on role in the running of NFC during 2024.
2. **Security Data and Privacy:** Given the data breaches in Australian Football, NFA reviewed our security in conjunction with FNSW and mitigated this risk.

Key Risk Open

1. **Player Welfare.** The shortage of Referees nationally had a direct effect on members 'Match Day Experience'. Referee coverage in NFA was around 70% in 2024. NRG continues to take this on board. However, maintaining referees is a national challenge, made difficult by the continuous acts of abusive behaviour towards referees on and off the field. NFA this season also experienced abusive behaviour on our fields resulting in the 'Three Strike Policy' having to be enacted towards Teams and Clubs. Further work into 2025 will be required to mitigate this risk.

NFC Executive Management Committee

Based on NFA's concern for the running of NFC, NFC did not re-elect some NFC exec roles, instead NFA placed a Caretaker Team into NFC to manage the club. Stacey Fanella, Linda Cerone, Steve Hurley and the author made up this group. The group met weekly with NFC Committee members to manage the club. Our goal was to bring financial discipline, transparency and a level of openness to the club that would benefit a pathway for community football and overall, help clubs to see the value of NFC., while also bringing a greater level of stability and purpose to NFC in its representation of our 30 clubs

NFA will appoint a new President to NFC in the coming weeks and step back from the management of NFC. I am happy to say we had success in 2024 in the management of NFC, the club is running to budget, contracts are scrutinised by our CEO and signed by nominated delegates from NFC & NFA. We are focused on upgrading the skillsets of our coaches in NFC and will promote greater participation in trials to make sure our members across NFA get the best return from NFC.

Junior Academy

During 2024 thanks to the work done by Stacey Fanella, Frances Refalo and Gail Macleod-Jones, NFA Board members, supported by NFC's Technical Director Rob Bradshaw, kicked off a Junior Academy. Rob and NFC coaches engaged clubs directly and attended Gala Days hand picking players to attend the Academy. This was a great example of creating a bridge between NFC and our clubs. We will encourage more connections to our clubs in 2025.

DIRECTOR REPORT - Gail Macleod-Jones

It's been a privilege to connect with our amazing clubs and our ever-growing Nepean FA football family this year. Visiting clubs, attending meetings, chatting with participants, watching matches, and participating in football activities have given me valuable insight into the many aspects of football. Our clubs are renowned for their welcoming and inclusive atmospheres, fostering a sense of community that transcends the boundaries of the field. I'm constantly inspired by the hard work of our club leaders who work tirelessly to cater to every member of the football family whilst demonstrating resilience and flexibility. The smiles on faces, the multigenerational family groups and the banter amongst players testify to the true enjoyment which football brings. From the youngest players and visitors to the most passionate supporters, clubs strive to create a game day experience that is safe and enjoyable for everyone.



Grievance and Disciplinary

Managing the less pleasant aspects of football is an ongoing challenge.

This year, new processes were implemented. The Three Strike Policy challenged clubs to establish and sustain a positive culture among their members. Recipients of Notice of Charges were given an option to plead guilty but have the sanction reviewed by an independent tribunal.

Never a dull moment in 2024, there were some unexpected and unprecedented behaviours that warranted attention. For some of these, the phrase 'Are you joking?' was the first reaction as the situation being presented seemed too absurd or outrageous to be true.

Letters of Warning were issued to some clubs, team officials, players and spectators. Whilst condemning the reported inappropriate conduct, the communications also offered an educational aspect, emphasising appropriate behaviour. In club-to-club matters, club leaders reached out to other clubs to address inappropriate conduct, facilitating effective and swift corrective measures.

One positive outcome was the rise in reported incidents of spectators reminding other spectators about appropriate conduct. I want to give recognition to those who donned marshal vests and provided meaningful assistance. Fellow spectators and marshals play a massive part in keeping our sidelines safe.

Very pleasingly, there was an overall improvement in conduct. Thank you to everyone for your support. Nepean FA is committed to upholding a high standard of conduct among its members. It does not tolerate antisocial behaviours or actions that have a negative impact on our sport. The goal is to promote a culture of respect and sportsmanship. Through implementing effective consequences for inappropriate behaviour, educational campaigns and ongoing efforts of everyone, Nepean FA is dedicated to continual improvement.

NEPEAN REFEREES GROUP REPORT - Nathan Marland



The 2024 season will be remembered as the year of the catch-up match. Many weekends were affected by wet weather and our Appointments teams did an outstanding job of ensuring maximum coverage was achieved. This is especially difficult during midweek fixtures, where availability of referees is limited.

As a group we covered approximately 6000 matches this year across all competitions, including Football NSW matches. Our coverage increased over the course of the season, falling just shy of 75% for the year, which is a dramatic improvement on previous years. This is despite our referee numbers remaining relatively steady, finishing the year at 178 members.



The group achieved numerous successes during the year. For the first time in recent memory, NRG were asked to officiate the All Age Mens State Cup Final, a great honour for the district and a testament to our reputation at the state level. We had two representatives at the National Youth Championships - well done to Ella McGarity and Grace Williams. Two NRG officials have been added to the A-Leagues panel for this season - Alexis Johnson and Molly Godsell.

This year also saw the successful launch of the green armband campaign and our cadet referee training sessions. The green armband program, which aims to identify junior officials and was supported by a marketing campaign, saw a noticeable reduction in the number of incidents involving junior officials this year. In addition, our cadet referee training sessions, which were designed to provide a pathway for cadet referees who are officiating club matches, saw close to 100 attendees over three nights.



I'd like to say a big thank you to the NRG Committee. You provide amazing support to both our referees and me. It is a very challenging role, and you have all handled the pressure exceptionally during the season.

The 2024 Winter season has been one to remember. With my first year back from maternity leave, it was nothing short of memorable.

Once again, we faced the challenges of floods and consistent wet weather putting a number of venues out of play for a large chunk of the season. We have a wonderful football community with surrounding clubs stepping up to help those clubs in need offering their fields as a permanent home field to those in need for midweek games, weekend games and training whilst their fields recovered. As a result of the wet weather, the synthetic fields at Jamison Park once again received a workout hosting competition games at the request of clubs, and acting as a training facility for a number of clubs.

Whilst many of our members felt they missed more games than they played, I am happy to advise the following stats regarding washed out games and rescheduled games.

Through the continued wet weather we averaged around 600 changes a week. It is always our intention to get as many people as possible on the park on any given weekend. A big thank you to those clubs and teams who went above and beyond to host games and play outside of regular time slots in order to get games played. There were some weekends with teams starting the day at 8:30 whilst others didn't kick off until 7pm. Most teams had a compact schedule towards the end of the season with some playing at least one midweek game and a weekend game for the latter half of the season. By doing so, this allowed us to complete the regular season to schedule and to continue with the Championship Tournament Series without the need to alter its format. Without this flexibility we wouldn't have finished the season the way we did.

Whilst our non-competition teams had the biggest impact this year, a special thanks goes out to those clubs who hosted catch-up games for their non-competition teams. Some clubs also went to the effort of hosting gala days run by the club open to surrounding clubs or association wide. Thank you for your efforts in providing additional games for these teams.

With the disruption to the regular season and its impact on the U5-U11 age groups, we decided to run an additional Gala Day that ran in conjunction with the Nepean FA Cup Finals Day to provide an opportunity for the non-competition teams to make up some of the games they missed out on. We had a total of 113 teams enter this additional Gala Day with a total of 168 games spread across the day. A special thanks to our host clubs Penrith FC and Penrith RSL SC for agreeing to host these games and for the assistance they provided in making the day the success it was.



We were blessed with beautiful weather for our annual Nepean FA Finals weekend. Once again, we had wonderful volunteer representation from our club committee members, who without, our weekend wouldn't run so smoothly. Congratulations to all teams who participated in the Nepean FA Finals Day and the efforts to make it that far.

I'd also like to make a special mention to all 2024 League Winners. It takes time, dedication, hard work and consistency and you should be very proud of your achievements.

NEPEAN SUMMER FOOTBALL REPORT

With a new look logo and vibe, Nepean Summer Football continues to see remarkable growth and development, reflecting the increasing popularity and participation in the sport.

Our focus this season was to continue to offer the same amazing summer experience while creating as many opportunities as possible for participation. By reviewing the schedule and incorporating extra match time each night, we maximised the usage of our synthetic fields. These fields have been instrumental in providing a reliable and consistent playing surface, regardless of weather conditions, thereby enhancing the overall football experience for all participants.

We have seen this translate into registrations with all but 4 of the 62 new team spots being filled, noting an increase from 278 to 340 teams this season, and 22.3% increase in registrations totally a staggering 2850 registrations.

One of the most notable trends this season is the significant increase in participation among female age groups, with the addition of all age groups from 8-16 included represented. This growth underscores the success of our initiatives aimed at promoting football among young women and girls, fostering a more inclusive and diverse sporting environment.

This season, we have revamped the competition format to better accommodate the diverse skill levels in Summer Football. The 12-week program will now feature a split league system. After the first 7 rounds, where each of the 8 teams plays against every other team once, the league will be divided based on table positions. The teams will then compete within their respective groups, leading up to a top 4 final.

Not without its challenges, staff changes, seeing the wonderful Aileen moving on from Nepean, leaving extra admin and referee appointments for the team this season. This has not stopped the summer football season commencing with resounding success, marked by increased participation, especially among female age groups, a significant rise in registrations, and the expansion of teams. We look forward to building on this success in the coming seasons.

This was very successful and supported by a large number of teams, including teams from Blaxland FC.



Achievements of note through the season included:

- U14.4, U15.2, U17.1, IW2 and AM5.White as League winners

With success measured by much more than winning games and trophies, again we have provided a healthy and safe platform for all players and supporters at Knapsack Park.

Despite many challenges during the season, our dedicated committee members ensured that, every week, all aspects of the Club and games were covered to the benefit and enjoyment of our members.

As is always the message at the Bluey’s - our players, members and supporters are the Club, and this season is testament to just how true a reflection this is of our Club community.





Colo Soccer Football Club

The 2024 season was a transformative year for Colo Soccer Football Club, marked by significant growth in committee members, player registrations, and team participation. These achievements stem from the implementation of an Infrastructure and Strategic Plan, designed to help Colo SFC achieve 1-Star recognition through the Club Changer Initiative and maintain its membership with the Good Sports Accreditation Scheme. Additionally, the launch of new Home and Away kits helped set a refreshed image and promoted a welcoming, family-oriented, and inclusive environment.

Female participation increased by 86%, with registrations growing from 143 in 2023 to 267 in 2024. This success can be attributed to the foundations laid through initiatives such as the Female Football Week - Skills Clinic.

In 2024, four female teams made it to Grand Finals (U13 Div 1 & 2, U14 Div 1, and Ruby League), three teams reached the Nepean Cup Finals (U14, U16, and Ruby League), and two teams (U14 Girls and Ruby League) represented Colo SFC in the prestigious Champion of Champions tournament. These achievements underscore the strength of the club's female soccer program & the collaboration among the coaching staff of the female teams.



Male registrations also rose, with 640 players in 2024, up from 590 in 2023. This growth enabled the club to field more competitive teams across multiple age groups, resulting in notable success.



Key male team achievements in 2024 include:

- U12 Mixed Div 3: Minor premiers and championship runners-up
- U16 Div 1: Minor premiers, Championship winners, Nepean Cup winners, and Champion of Champions representation
- U17 Div 2: Championship winners
- AAM U21: Nepean Cup finalists and Champion of Champions representation
- Waratah League: Competition and Championship runners-up

Challenges Faced and Solutions Implemented:

Managing Player Growth: The surge in player registrations created logistical challenges, especially in terms of field availability and lighting. To address this, Colo SFC developed a training schedule and allocated field space across two venues, ensuring teams had appropriate training areas suited to their age and group size.

Plans for the Future


Investment in Coaching: The club plans to further invest in coaching development by offering more clinics and professional opportunities. Male and female coaching coordinators will lead collaborative efforts to ensure all teams receive high-quality guidance.

Facility Upgrades: Colo SFC's infrastructure plan includes lighting upgrades at Cougar Park to accommodate the growing player base. Stage 1, which involved upgrading the power supply, has already been completed with the help of government grants.

Community Engagement: Colo SFC will continue to strengthen its community engagement through events, workshops, and social activities, fostering a sense of unity and belonging. The club also aims to achieve 2-Star recognition under the Club Changer Program.

The 2024 season was a pivotal year for Colo SFC, with significant growth in both male and female programs. 2024 was Colo's first year of the inclusion of an under 5's competition within our in-house program. Despite challenges, the club thrived and is well-positioned for continued success in the years to come.





Cranebrook United Football Club

Despite the unfortunate wet weather, CUFC had a great season. Our amazing committee and volunteers were actively involved, ensuring our junior and senior teams were well equipped for the season.

This year we had 605 members; this includes our awesome volunteers. We had 47 teams this year. Our Miniroos teams consisted of four U5, four U6, six U7, four U8, three U9, four U10 and four U11 teams. Our Junior Competition teams consisted of two U12, one U13, two U14 Boys and one U14 Girls team. Our senior teams keep growing, an)35 team, eight AAM's teams and three AAL's teams.

It has been another great year for Emu Plains Football Club. On the back of the success of the Matildas and our female focussed clinics, we were able to field 'all girls' teams from u8s and upward this year. We also saw a spike in participation numbers with our All Age Men teams, including the return of our first-grade side in the Waratah League.

The club has grown from 636 players to 743 players, with 129 additional members, made up of coaches, managers and committee members.

This enabled all games going ahead as well as NFA rescheduling Seven Sunday games there as the rest of the district was closed.

“This year has been another amazing year, sticking to our plan we again focused on female player participation with our Club, as well as focusing on Cadet Referees and the need for NRG affiliated Referees or Certified Club Referees to unofficially Ref when required.

I am happy to report that all of these goals where, to a degree, achieved in 2024 with the addition of a second all age Ladies team and our first ever junior female teams in u9 girls and u13 girls, with our u13s making the Grand final. As well as 6 cadet referees completing courses and 1 senior ref joining NRG. We will again head into the 2025 season with these goals being a big part of our strategy in preparing for our expected continued growth. In terms of our teams on the field this year we have seen a 9.1% increase in player participation, compared to 307 players in 2023, this year we had a total of 335 players - totalling 27 teams, 22 junior teams (up from 18 last year and 5 senior teams, down one from last year). However, keep in mind that we also lost a total of 36 players, 2 teams in the 2023 Waratah Squad at the end of 2023, which brings our increase in new players in 2024 to 64.

On the field our teams excelled again, with our under 14s winning the Minor Premiership for the second year and going on to win the Grand Final after losing last year. We also had our Senior Div 6 All Age team win on Grand Final Day after finishing 5th in the regular season. Another great success was our new women's and junior girls teams this year, Firstly, our new Senior girls who played Division 3 alongside our already established ladies Division 3 team. They had an up and down year on the score board but showed effort and passion all year in a division above their level. (WFC club error) Our New u9s girls team although not competition, and being the 1st year playing for some, had a very good year with lots of fun, learning and very few losses.

Our U13 Girls had an extraordinary year, starting the year strong before sickness hit the team mid-season. Causing the team to be short and down 2-3 players a week over a 4-week period, they Dug deep in the once everyone was back on deck, and pushed their way back up the ladder finishing 4th. They backed that up with some awesome efforts in the finals series making it through to the grand final. This was also achieved with 8 of these 14 girls playing football for the first time, so, although the girls didn't get the win on the day they can be extremely proud of themselves.



I would like to say on behalf of Warradale FC, a big thankyou to all these girls and ladies, their coaches and Managers and our members, I feel we all joined forces to make these teams happen as a club, and the success has been fantastic. To the players directly, we are as a club proud of your achievements, and I hope you are just as proud of yourselves. You should be. Thank you for representing Warradale FC and helping us be the best club we can be. Let's make next season even better.

Moving forward to next year and beyond, again we expect to increase by a minimum of 10 percent in 2025. The club has been monitoring our growth for close to 10 years now and we feel we will hit registration numbers of 450 -500 by 2028/29. This is a significant milestone for our club and one the club is very mindful off as we would be close to full capacity with the facility's we have today.

On another note, I can report that we have been contacted by Wollondilly Council in the last week, informing us that we will soon be invited to start the discussions on the upcoming plans to upgrade Waterboard Oval and its Amenities. (West Invest Grant) These works are expected to start approx. late 2026 early 2027 and finish late 2027 early 2028 Approx. Dates to be confirmed.

As President I am very excited for these works to be happening as I feel the new Amenities, including change rooms and referee rooms as well as the field upgrade with an extra field are important to the rapid growth of our club and its current and future committees to be able to properly manage that growth.

Wentworth Falls Football Club

Wentworth Falls Football Club (WFFC) had a great season this year thanks to all the amazing volunteers that lent a hand. Many members of the WFFC community came together to provide a fun, friendly and safe environment for our players. One of the standout moments for the season was when our U12/7, U14/4, and U15/3 teams competed in the grand finals—and each one came away with a win!

This year, we welcomed 717 members to our club, with 563 participating as players in the winter competition. The remaining members included coaches, managers, and dedicated volunteers. We saw a remarkable 29% increase in player registrations compared to last year, allowing us to field a total of 48 teams. Among our community, we registered 225 females, making up 31% of our total membership. Specifically, the number of female players rose to 157, an increase from 122 the previous year, representing 28% of all players.



The club continues to focus on increasing female participation by actively taking steps including female only tournaments/clinics and grant applications. This is reflected in the gradual increase in female registrants over the years. To help promote female football, participation and retention WFFC launched the Unity Cup this year. It is an initiative to celebrate, promote and unify female football in the Blue Mountains. It was sponsored by Sparrows Leura. We also established The Leah Blayney Award to recognise the outstanding player of the Unity Cup and our local football hero. This year, the cup and award only involved the two neighbouring clubs Hazelbrook football club and WFFC with a view to expand to other clubs in the Blue Mountains in future years. Our local all abilities team was also invited to participate and play against one of our junior teams. In addition, we successfully received a Growing football grant for an educational series that targets females. The educational series; Let's talk football; will launch next year. Finally, this year WFFC introduced 4 weeks of Mini Tillies clinics. We receive very positive feedback from the community in regard to the clinics and as a result we are looking to run them again this coming year.

In 2025, our club will reach its 50th anniversary. To celebrate this WFFC is releasing a new playing strip. The chosen strip was the result of an online competition. This year the club was sponsored by 14 local businesses. The sponsorship funds were very valuable and because of them we were able to provide training shirts to all our players, coaches and managers. Funds were also used in housekeeping costs. Our sponsors for 2024 were Mountain High Pies, Bendigo Community Bank, Branches Timbercraft, Mitre 10 Katoomba, AJ Pilla Constructions, against the grain, Black cockatoo bakery, Mountain mowing and maintenance, Katoomba cabling telephone service, Pulse first aid training, Purcell Property, and H2O Bathrooms. We are very grateful for their ongoing support.

This year, we undertook additional maintenance for our fields, but coordinating the work alongside our summer and winter competition schedules was and is challenging. We faced difficulties in balancing the Council's maintenance requirements with our members' training needs. Thankfully, our community was understanding and flexible, which helped ensure a smooth transition during this inconvenient period.

Our annual Summer Football Competition was again highly successful for the club. It is the only summer competition in Nepean that runs through the from October to February and it includes both winter-registered players and a sizeable proportion of summer social players. This last summer we had a total of 792 registered players - 466 Juniors and 326 Seniors - which was a record number of participants for us. Games were played across both Friday and some Tuesday nights. Many thanks to all involved in the organisation of; the participants in; and the NRG referees for covering the competition.

Our committee had a busy and productive year. We drafted/reviewed policies, organized two Gala Days, and held "Come and Try" events for U12 to AA, as well as junior clinics for U6-U12 and a preseason day for U13-U17. We also coordinated club game days and trial games and implemented a centralized system for storing club information. To enhance communication, we established a WhatsApp system linking all teams for instant updates on club news, allowing us to share important information quickly and efficiently. We also introduced a yearly newsletter as another way to keep our members informed. Additionally, we welcomed a new photographer who has captured stunning high-resolution still and action shots of our players, enriching our community's experience.

Last year, the club launched a new canteen to serve the community, but it initially faced many challenges. Now, the canteen is thriving and operating effectively. Our members and spectators appreciate the freshly brewed coffee and healthy options, making the canteen a beloved addition to the community.

We continued to work on our 5-year club strategy to grow a culture of camaraderie, inclusivity and friendship, having better systems for how we manage and order equipment, better communication with members and establishing 3-year sponsorships arrangements. In the future we would like to start collaborating with local schools, recruit community members skilled in grant applications, and other volunteers and apply for grants to improve our facilities so that our players can have a better overall experience.
